Joseph Polizzotto served as Managing Director and General Counsel for the Americas of Deutsche Bank, from March 2009 to June 2014. He worked briefly at Barclays Capital after serving as the General Counsel of Lehman Brothers from 1999 to October 2008. Previously, he was the Global Director of Litigation and Regulatory at Lehman, and was also the Director of Litigation at Lehman's predecessor, Shearson Lehman Brothers, which he joined in 1989.
